Knowledge is Power!

Knowing the laws and acts of Rights of Way on UK roads and highways is important for all horse owners and riders. Access training days are a great way of learning all about the laws and issues surrounding your rights to ride and carriage drive.

There are three levels of courses available from the BHS. Level One: Basic Highway Law and Local Plans; Level Two: User Evidence, Documentary Evidence, Definitive Maps and Wider Access and Level Three: Advanced Highway Law. Open to all, though it is designed as a continuation of Level Two

Training is essential for BHS Access and Bridleways Officers, but is open to anyone wishing to improve or extend safe off route access for equestrians in their local area. If you are interested in attending any of these courses, please contact us for more information.
